One should also mention the fruitful ideas of the naturalization of HIV in the area of science, philosophy and legal science; and the idea of a new ethico-political consensus after the practices of the antiretroviral era, in this case the right to death (Carletti 2010). In his text (2003), Sandro Casas presents the history of homosexuality as a process. One, which was dictated by the dominance of the Church and the state. As the National Museum of Anthropology was housed in the complex, this case was seen as one of the facts of the National Museum of Anthropology. This decision created great public uproar, many of which demanded the removal of the murals. Many of the murals were removed from public view, but not the Museum. This, in fact, was a very similar case to that of Comarcas and Leyendas of the National Museum of Anthropology, and was eventually removed from the National Museum of Anthropology in 2011. In such a case, the history of homosexuality, not only in Latin America but also in other parts of the world, has been formed by the same trajectory that has affected the various homosexualisms of the empire.
